

**MINUTES OF THE DDC MEETING FOR THE MONTHS OF AUGUST 2026, IN
RESPECT OF SRIBHUMI DISTRICT**

The meeting was chaired by Shri Lalrohlu Khiengte, ACS, District Development Commissioner i/c, Sribhumi.

At the outset the District Development Commissioner i/c, Sribhumi, welcomed all the members and officials present in the meeting.

Thereafter, the District Development Commissioner i/c, reviewed the progress of works of various departments and decisions and directions in the meeting was recorded department wise as follows:

1. Panchayat & Rural Development (P&RD):

The DDC i/c reviewed the progress of various schemes being implemented under the Panchayat & Rural Development Department. During the review of Aadhaar seeding and e-KYC under MGNREGA, the Chief Executive Officer, Zilla Parishad (CEO, ZP) informed the House that 88.91% of beneficiaries have completed e-KYC. The CEO, ZP further apprised that necessary measures have been undertaken to achieve 90% e-KYC coverage by 15th August, 2026. Regarding the implementation of VB-G RAM-G for FY 2026-27, it was informed that 64.80% of households have availed employment under the scheme. Among the Development Blocks, Bhairab Nagar Development Block recorded the highest coverage at 87.31%, while Patherkandi Development Block recorded the lowest coverage at 37.80%. With regard to PMAY-G, the CEO, ZP informed that 87.46% of the targeted works have been completed. The DDC i/c directed the concerned officials to closely monitor the remaining works and ensure their timely completion. Regarding the 15th Finance Commission, the CEO informed the House that the tentative allotment has been received from the Government.

The DDC i/c requested the CEO, ZP and all concerned officials to closely monitor the implementation and progress of all schemes under the Department and ensure timely achievement of the prescribed targets.

(Action: CEO, ZP / All BDOs)

2. Cooperation:

The District Deputy Registrar informed the House that the computerisation of Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS) in Sribhumi District has achieved 93.10% progress. Out of 29 PACS identified for computerisation, 27 PACS have already been completed.

Regarding the construction of godowns having a storage capacity of 2,500 MT, it was informed that a minimum of 4 bighas of land is required. The DDC i/c advised the District Deputy Registrar to take up the matter with the concerned Circle Officer for identification/allotment of suitable land and early resolution of the issue.

As regards PMKSK, the DDC i/c directed the District Deputy Registrar to consult with the concerned officials of Dima Hasao District and take necessary measures to resolve the issue relating to various components of PMKSK being reflected as “0” on the portal.

(Action: District Deputy Registrar, Cooperation)

3. Labour Welfare:

The DDC i/c reviewed the activities of the department, including the progress of e-SHRAM registration in the district. The Labour Officer was instructed to undertake awareness programmes on the self-enumeration process, particularly in tea garden areas, both personally and through subordinate Labour Inspectors.

(Action: Labour Officer)

4. District Industries & Commerce Centre (DICC):

The General Manager, DICC informed the House that under PMEGP 2025–26, 66 units have been sanctioned out of 235 units sponsored to banks. Under PMFME for FY 2026–27, against a target of 85 beneficiaries, 36 cases have been sponsored to banks, out of which 5 cases have been sanctioned, while 31 cases remain pending with banks. Under CMAAA, 2,403 beneficiaries have been selected, however, 27 beneficiaries are yet to draw their cheques. The DDC i/c directed the General Manager, DICC to contact the absentee beneficiaries and facilitate early disbursement.

(Action: General Manager, DICC)

5. Legal Metrology:

The DDC i/c reviewed the activities of the department and directed the officials to conduct regular surveillance and monitoring of fair price shops, petrol pumps and market places.

(Action: Inspector, Legal Metrology)

6. Town & Country Planning:

The officials informed the House that under PMAY-U, 9,574 houses have been completed against the target of 10,432 houses. The DDC i/c directed the department to expedite the remaining works and ensure early completion of all targeted houses.

(Action: Deputy Director i/c, Town & Country Planning)

7. Taxes:

The Assistant Commissioner of Taxes informed the House regarding revenue collection for the month of July, 2026 as follows:

- SGST – Rs. 3,21,68,821.00
- VAT (IMFL & Others) – Rs. 1,67,15,962.00
- Professional Tax – Rs. 1,44,63,611.00
- Assam Electricity Duty – Rs. 42,103.00

The DDC i/c requested the department to take necessary measures for achievement of the annual revenue targets.

(Action: Assistant Commissioner of Taxes)

8. Excise:

The Inspector of Excise informed the House that revenue amounting to Rs. 3,34,26,923.06 has been collected up to July, 2026. The DDC i/c directed the department to intensify raids in different parts of the district, particularly in tea garden areas.

(Action: Superintendent, Excise)

9. Sericulture:

The DDC i/c reviewed the activities of the department. The Assistant Director informed that three proposals have been submitted to the Government and are awaiting for approval. It was further informed that the MRMA Programme was scheduled to be launched on 10th August, 2026.

10. Sports:

The District Sports Officer informed the House that no new schemes have been sanctioned at present. It was further informed that the Khel Maharan programme will commence from September, 2026.

11. APDCL:

The DDC i/c reviewed the progress of ongoing APDCL projects and other schemes in the district. The AGM (Projects) informed the House that the 33/11 kV Substations at Sonakhira and Gamaria have already been commissioned. The works of the 33/11 kV Substations at Aylabari and Bazarghat are in progress and targeted for completion by September and October, 2026 respectively. The AGM also presented the progress of RDSS Loss Reduction Scheme, RDSS Additional Household Electrification Scheme and PM Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana.

Regarding utility shifting estimates for Lowairpoa Road, APDCL assured that the required estimates would be submitted at the earliest.

(Action: AGM, APDCL)

12. Forest (Social Forestry):

The officials informed that no new schemes have been taken up and only maintenance of nurseries and plantation works under CAMPA are presently being undertaken.

13. Soil Conservation:

The Ranger, Soil Conservation informed that one scheme is presently under execution, having achieved 95% physical progress and is expected to be completed shortly.

14. Transport:

The DTO informed the House that revenue amounting to Rs. 8,27,95,917.00 had been collected up to July, 2026. The DDC i/c directed the DTO to intensify vehicle checking and ensure strict compliance with the prescribed rules and regulations.

(Action: DTO)

15. Animal Husbandry & Veterinary:

The District Veterinary Officer informed that 8,354 treatments were provided during July, 2026. Regular awareness camps are also being conducted across the district.

16. Fisheries:

The DDC i/c reviewed the implementation of PMMSY schemes and directed the department to expedite all pending works. Regarding KCC, the DFDO informed that against 30 applications forwarded to banks during FY 2025–26, only one application has been sanctioned.

The DDC i/c expressed concern over the low sanction rate and directed the department to pursue the matter with banks for early disposal of pending applications.

(Action: DFDO)

17. Health:

The Joint Director of Health Services informed that National Deworming Day will be observed on 17th August, 2026 for children aged 1–19 years under PM-ABHIM. The DDC i/c requested the department to take necessary steps for successful implementation of the programme.

Regarding civil works, it was informed that out of 74 sanctioned schemes, 17 have been completed, 40 are in progress and 3 schemes have been stopped due to the demise of contractors.

(Action: Joint Director of Health Services)

18. Water Resources:

The DDC i/c reviewed the progress of schemes under SOPD-G and PDNA. The Executive Engineer informed that 4 no. of schemes are under implementation under SOPD-G and 10 nos of schemes under PDNA.

The DDC i/c directed the department to expedite all ongoing works and maintain quality standards.

(Action: Executive Engineer, Water Resources)

19. Women & Child Development:

The DDC i/c reviewed the progress of construction of Anganwadi Centres under NIDA-I, NIDA-II, RIDF-I, RIDF-II, SC-BC and SOPD. Under NIDA-II, out of 185 sanctioned AWCs, final installments have been released for 52 centres and 35 centres have been completed.

The DDC i/c expressed concern that no Anganwadi Centre has been completed in R.K. Nagar LAC and Karimganj North LAC and directed the department to expedite the works.

(Action: DSWO)

20. Agriculture:

The DDC i/c reviewed PM-KISAN, Digital Crop Survey (AgriStack) and other programmes. The department was directed to expedite farmer registration and paddy procurement activities.

(Action: DAO)

21. Education:

The DDC i/c reviewed the progress of works under SSA. The DPE, SSA informed that the Government Higher Secondary School project has achieved 95% physical progress. Under PM-SHRI Schools, the schemes construction of one Science Laboratory and one Library for FY 2025–26 have achieved 85–95% physical progress and furniture has already been ordered. Under PM POSHAN, 382 Kitchen-cum-Stores have been completed out of 384 sanctioned works, while two are in progress.

The DDC i/c directed the department to complete all ongoing works at the earliest.

(Action: Inspector of Schools / DPE, SSA)

22. Food, Public Distribution & Consumer Affairs:

The DDC i/c reviewed rice distribution, paddy procurement and Aadhaar seeding activities. The department was requested to maintain regular surveillance over prices of essential commodities and report any abnormal fluctuations.

(Action: DDS i/c)

23. PHE:

The Executive Engineer informed that out of 700 JJM schemes, 577 schemes have been handed over, of which 376 are fully functional, 86 partially functional and 115 non-functional.

The DDC i/c directed the department to ensure full functionality of JJM schemes and convene coordination meetings with line departments whenever necessary.

(Action: Executive Engineer, PHE)

24. Irrigation:

The Executive Engineers informed that out of three schemes under Patherkandi and R.K. Nagar Divisions, one has been completed and two have achieved 68% to 95% physical progress. Under SOPD, the physical progress of schemes in Sribhumi North and South Divisions ranges from 70% to 75%.

The DDC i/c requested both Executive Engineers to expedite the works within the stipulated timeline.

(Action: Executive Engineers, North & South Sribhumi division/ RK Nagar & Patherkandi Division)

25. PWRD (Roads):

The DDC i/c reviewed the progress of schemes under both divisions. The Executive Engineers informed that progress has been affected due to incessant rainfall; however, work would be accelerated during the dry season. The Executive Engineer, PWRD, RK Nagar Patharkandi TRD informed that communication has been made with the APDCL authorities for submission of the estimate for utility shifting in respect of (1) Lowairpoa- Road and (2) Anipur-Zamuang Road. However, the same is yet to be received from their end.

The DDC i/c directed both Executive Engineers to ensure timely completion of all ongoing works. Further AGM, APDCL directed to submit the utility shifting estimate at earliest.

(Action: Executive Engineers, North & South Sribhumi division/ RK Nagar & Patherkandi Division/ AGM, APDCL)

26. PWD (Building):

The DDC i/c reviewed the progress of major infrastructure projects. The Executive Engineer informed that the Construction of Medical College & Hospital at R.K. Nagar has achieved 27.89% physical progress. The Co-District Commissioner Office buildings at R.K. Nagar and Patharkandi have achieved 43% and 41% physical progress respectively.

The DDC i/c directed the Executive Engineer to ensure that all works are executed as per the approved schedule and completed within the stipulated timeframe.

(Action: Executive Engineer, PWD Building)

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks from the Chair.
